MEMBERSHIP CLASSIFICATIONS

Contractor Member - A contractor member will be an individual, firm or corporation who, as a prime contractor or co-venturer, undertakes to perform highway-heavy-municipal and utilities work in its entirety or at least partly with its own contracting forces.

Only general contractors who have been engaged in general contracting at least two years prior to applying for membership in the Association and have established a reputation for skill, integrity and responsibility shall be eligible for membership.

Subcontractor Member - A subcontractor member will be an individual, firm or corporation, who undertakes to perform highway-heavy-municipal and utilities work with its own forces. This classification will only be available providing its prime contract volume does not exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per year, as provided in Article VI, Section 2 of the Chapter Bylaws, and there is no association by way of the same principal or principals to a general contracting firm actively engaged in the construction industry. The subcontractor member shall have no vote.

Associate Member - Any reputable individual, firm or corporation able to supply materials, machinery, supplies or service to members of this Association, and who is not associated by way of the same principal or principals to a sub or general contracting firm actively engaged in the construction industry, is eligible for associate membership. The associate member shall have no vote.

RESIGNATIONS

No member may withdraw from the Association until the member has submitted to the President and CEO a written resignation, by certified or registered mail, with return receipt requested by the member, accompanied by his remittance in full of all dues and volume dues outstanding. If any member resigns, or if his membership is in any other manner terminated prior to the 31st day of December in any year, he shall be bound to pay the dues set forth in Article VI, thereof, prior to the effective date of such resignation or other termination and subsequent to the 31st day of December immediately preceding such resignation or other termination date. The duty of the Association to furnish its services to such member shall cease as of the effective date of such resignation or termination.

DELINQUENT POLICY

At the September 18, 1986 Board of Directors Meeting the following policy was adopted: If dues are not paid within sixty (60) days from the beginning of the Chapter fiscal year, all membership services will be suspended, including the weekly mailing information. Members will be advised at the thirty (30) and sixty (60) day periods from the beginning of the Chapter fiscal year of their delinquency. If at the Board of Directors Meeting immediately following the suspension of all membership services, dues remain unpaid, the firms' membership will be terminated by vote of the Board and outside collection proceedings by Dun & Bradstreet, Inc. will start for the collection of membership dues from the beginning of the Chapter fiscal year up to the date of membership termination.
